New Season, Same God: Day 1

Devotional: As we stand at the threshold of change, it's natural to focus on external transformations - new habits, goals, or circumstances. 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Rekindling the Fire: Day 2

Bible Verse: “But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him.” - 1 Corinthians 2:9

Reflection Question: What activities or practices once filled you with spiritual passion, and how can you intentionally return to them?

Quote: The fire of God is the fuel of victory.

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Healing from Church Hurts: Day 3

Bible Verse: “Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.” - 1 John 3:2

Reflection Question: How have past church experiences affected your current spiritual journey, and what steps can you take toward healing?

Quote: Don't allow church baggage to rob you of your spiritual space.

Prayer: Father, heal the wounds that have created distance between me and Your church. Help me see beyond the past hurts to the beauty of Your bride. Restore my ability to trust and connect within the body of Christ. Amen.



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Spiritual Vision in Natural Times: Day 4

Devotional: Living with spiritual vision means seeing beyond our natural circumstances to God's greater reality. In a world that prioritizes what can be seen and measured, maintaining spiritual perspective requires intentional focus. This isn't about denying reality but about recognizing a higher truth: we are spiritual beings having a natural experience. When we view our challenges through this lens, we can maintain hope and expectancy even in difficult seasons.

Bible Verse: “He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.” - Psalm 91:1

Reflection Question: In what current situation do you need to shift from a natural perspective to a spiritual one?

Quote: We're not a natural being having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings living a natural experience.

Prayer: God, help me see my circumstances through Your eyes. Strengthen my spiritual vision and help me recognize Your work even in challenging times. Let me live as the spiritual being You created me to be. Amen.



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Moving Forward with Expectancy: Day 5

Devotional: God's plans for our lives don't diminish because of difficult seasons or past disappointments. When we choose to live with spiritual expectancy, we position ourselves for divine encounters and breakthrough moments. This isn't about blind optimism but about grounded faith in God's faithfulness. Bible Verse: “He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.” - Psalm 91:1

Quote: I will make moves this year as God reawakens my spiritual expectancy. I will no longer settle to live stuck and without hope.

Prayer: Lord, restore my spiritual expectancy. Help me refuse to settle for less than Your best. Awaken fresh hope in my heart and help me recognize Your movement in my life. Amen.
